A person commits the offense of obstructing identification when she intentionally or knowingly furnishes a false or fictitious name, residence address, or date of birth to a peace officer who has lawfully detained the defendant.

To sustain the charge of obstructing identification, the State must prove the following propositions:

First Proposition: That the defendant intentionally or knowingly furnished a false or fictitious name, residence address, or date of birth to a peace officer; and *Second Proposition:* That the peace officer had lawfully detained the defendant.

If you find from your consideration of all the evidence that this proposition has been proved beyond a reasonable doubt, you should find the defendant guilty.

If you find from your consideration of all the evidence that this proposition has not been proved beyond a reasonable doubt, you should find the defendant not guilty
